



December 8, 2003 Electronic Bulletin No. 451 RE: Northeast Snow Storm

The Northeast is digging out of the recent snowstorm that has plagued the northeastern region for the past 72 hours.

The rail ramps supporting Baltimore, Kearny (Harrisburg), Philly, Harrisburg, Little Ferry, Bergen and many of the New England ramps including Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Boston, Syracuse and Worcester and open but operating at a limited capacity as the CSX railroad continues to plow the terminals and eradicate snow drifts in the terminals - 5 to 6 foot high in some locations.

Overall, all of the major rail ramps supporting the Northeast have been negatively affected by the recent storm and it will take the balance of the week to return to normalcy. Outside of terminal delays, many trains operating to and from these locations have been delayed because of the snow and icy highway conditions make it difficult to shuttle crews to and from trains.
